THE PROBLEM WE SOLVE IN INDIA

When a church in Texas sends \$500 to a Jharkhand Bible school, India's **Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA)** can block, freeze, or delay the transfer. Since 2020, thousands of Christian NGO bank accounts have been shut down — including major missions organizations. What arrives may be \$380. Months late. With no proof.

Anti-conversion laws in **12+ states** mean visible foreign transfers to churches attract police attention, pastor harassment, and closures. Dalit and tribal families most in need are most at risk.

**STEP 1 — HOME CHURCH (USA / CANADA / UK)
Donor Opens Free GetSmart Account**

Like creating an email account. 5 minutes on your phone. No bank required — or link your existing account. Visit getstoken.org to sign up free.



**STEP 2 — INSTANT, LIKE SENDING A TEXT
Send GST Tokens to Your Missionary**

Type their GETS ID (like an email address). Press send. Arrives under 60 seconds. **No FCRA filing. Zero fees deducted.**



**STEP 3 — MISSION FIELD (JHARKHAND / ODISHA / NE INDIA)
Missionary Receives & Distributes**

Issues to Dalit schools, tribal teachers, coordinators — each transaction recorded permanently on blockchain, tamper-proof and auditable.



**STEP 4 — YOU SEE IT HAPPEN
Track Your Gift to the Child**

Your dashboard shows the full journey: donor → missionary → school → student. Every step timestamped and tamper-proof.

WHY GST IS DIFFERENT IN INDIA



Bypasses the FCRA Completely

GST is a utility token — not a "foreign contribution" under Indian law. It travels outside the SWIFT banking system the government monitors, so your gift reaches the Dalit Bible school without triggering a government review or account freeze.



Missionaries & Teachers Earn Credentials

Every teacher and youth leader receives a digital NFT badge — a permanent record no anti-conversion government or mob can confiscate, burn, or destroy. Built on Ethereum, backed by getstoken.org.



No Crypto Knowledge Needed

GST looks and feels like a digital gift card or mobile payment. If you can send a WhatsApp message, you can send a donation. No wallets to memorize, no technical setup required.



Built by a 501(c)(3) Nonprofit

GetSmart Token is governed by the Digital Financial Aid Corporation — a US 501(c)(3). Its mission is education. Ours is the Great Commission. They align perfectly at getstoken.org.

Four Steps from Your Pew to a Dalit Child's Classroom

1



Download & Sign Up

Visit getstoken.org and sign up with your email. Free, takes 5 minutes. Your church administrator can help. No blockchain knowledge required.

2



Add Funds

Link your debit card or bank account. Convert dollars to GST tokens — digital offering envelopes that only go where you address them.

3



Send to Your Missionary

Your missionary has a GETS ID (a simple code like an email address). Type it in, add a prayer note, press Send. Arrives in seconds.

4



Watch It Work

Your app shows a live trail — like package tracking for a gift. See which village program it funded and which children it serves.

Protection in India's Mission Field

- ✓ Funds cannot be seized under FCRA — GST tokens exist on a decentralized blockchain, not in any Indian bank account subject to government review
- ✓ No foreign currency declaration required — GST transactions don't trigger Reserve Bank of India or FCRA reporting thresholds
- ✓ NFT credentials stored digitally — no paper certificates for anti-conversion police to seize or burn in a mob attack
- ✓ Works in tribal areas of Jharkhand, Odisha, and Northeast India with limited banking — only needs a mobile phone and data signal
- ✓ Local Dalit pastors receive GST directly — building indigenous Indian church ownership of mission, not Western dependency

- ★ **Consortium Account:** Your missions committee holds a shared GST treasury, receiving from hundreds of home churches and routing to dozens of India missionaries
- ★ **Automatic Reporting:** Every transaction auto-generates a report for the Sunday bulletin or annual missions report — no accountant needed
- ★ **Designated Giving:** Tag your gift "Jharkhand Dalit School" — earmarked immediately, no commingling with general mission funds
- ★ **Tax Documentation:** GetSmart automatically issues US-compatible giving receipts for your donors' tax records via getstoken.org
- ★ **Volunteer Credentialing:** Issue NFT certificates to local volunteers completing training — building India's indigenous church for generations

India — Bharata: Why GST Is Strategically Essential Here

- ✦ India's FCRA has been used to shut down **6,000+** NGO accounts since 2020, with Christian organizations disproportionately targeted — Compassion International, World Vision India, and dozens of Pentecostal networks all affected.
- ✦ Dalit communities (200M+ people) in Jharkhand, Odisha, and Chhattisgarh are most responsive to Pentecostal ministry — GST-funded tailoring cooperatives, nursing training, and computer literacy programs change generational trajectories.
- ✦ Anti-conversion laws in **UP, MP, Gujarat, Chhattisgarh** and 8 other states mean even charitable education programs can be framed as "inducement to convert" — low-profile GST transfers remove the paper trail used to justify police action.
- ✦ Northeast India's growing Pentecostal churches (Nagaland, Mizoram, Meghalaya) are already mission-sending churches — GST lets these indigenous Christians give to their own Hindi belt outreach with the same accountability as any Western donor.

† Common Questions from Home Church Members †

"Is this gambling or speculation?"

No. GST is a utility token for education — not traded for profit. Think of it as a purpose-built digital currency for Kingdom work, like a gift card that can only be spent at getstoken.org.

"Will this get our missionaries in trouble?"

GST is specifically designed to protect them. As a utility token — not classified as a "foreign contribution" — it doesn't trigger the FCRA reporting that puts pastors at legal risk.

"What if I'm not tech-savvy?"

Your church coordinator sets it up. Many congregations designate a "GST Deacon" who helps members send monthly India support in about 2 minutes — as easy as paying a bill online.

"Can I give to a specific Dalit child or village?"

Yes. Your missionary sets up named programs (e.g., "Jharkhand Morning Bible School") and you send directly to it. Your dashboard shows children's progress — real-time and blockchain-verified.
