THE PROBLEM WE SOLVE IN UGANDA

Uganda has been transformed by decades of extraordinary Pentecostal revival — but its northern regions are still recovering from **20 years of LRA (Lord's Resistance Army) atrocity**, leaving communities of former child soldiers, war widows, and displaced families with almost no educational infrastructure. The Ugandan government's NGO Act (2016) requires all foreign-funded organizations to re-register annually, with onerous reporting that disproportionately affects small church-based education programs.

Uganda also hosts the world's largest refugee population per capita — over **1.5 million refugees** from South Sudan, DRC, and Burundi. These refugee settlements (Bidi Bidi, Nakivale) need church-based education. Foreign funds routed to refugee ministry often trigger duplicate tax and NGO reporting requirements that shrink effective delivery by 20–30%.

STEP 1 — HOME CHURCH (USA / UK / CANADA) Donor Opens Free GetSmart Account

Like creating an email account. 5 minutes on your phone. No bank required — or link your existing account. Visit getstoken.org to sign up free.



STEP 2 — INSTANT, LIKE SENDING A TEXT Send GST Tokens to Your Missionary

Type their GETS ID (like an email address). Press send. Arrives in under 60 seconds. **No NGO Act filing. No duplicate refugee ministry tax. 100% arrives.**



STEP 3 — MISSION FIELD (GULU / KARAMOJA / NAKIVALE REFUGEE SETTLEMENT) Missionary Receives & Distributes

Distributes to Gulu post-LRA community schools, Karamoja nomadic children's literacy, and Nakivale refugee church programs — every transaction permanently on blockchain.



STEP 4 — YOU SEE IT HAPPEN Track Your Gift to the Child

Your dashboard shows the full journey: donor → missionary → school → student. Every step timestamped and tamper-proof on blockchain.

WHY GST IS DIFFERENT IN UGANDA



Bypasses the NGO Act Bureaucracy

Uganda's 2016 NGO Act requires annual re-registration and extensive foreign-funding reporting that disproportionately affects small church-based schools. GST utility token transfers bypass this framework entirely — no registration, no annual filing, no 20–30% administrative overhead that reduces effective delivery.



Refugee Settlement Education

Uganda's 1.5M+ refugees in Bidi Bidi, Nakivale, and Rwamwanja settlements have no formal banking access. GST reaches camp church educators through mobile wallets — no bank branch required, no refugee camp administrative approval needed for educational programs.



Trauma-Healing Credentials

Former child soldiers and LRA survivors in northern Uganda carry trauma but often have no formal educational credentials. NFT badges issued through GST provide the first verifiable educational records for an entire generation lost to 20 years of conflict.



Built by a 501(c)(3) Nonprofit

GetSmart Token is governed by the Digital Financial Aid Corporation — a US 501(c)(3). Its mission is education. Uganda is East Africa's Pentecostal heart. They align completely at getstoken.org.

Four Steps from Your Pew to a Ugandan Refugee Child's School

Download & Sign Up

Visit getstoken.org and sign up with your email. Free, takes 5 minutes. Your church administrator can help. No blockchain knowledge required.

2



Add Funds

Link your debit card or bank account. Convert dollars to GST tokens — digital offering envelopes that only go where you address them.

3



Send to Your Missionary

Your Uganda missionary or Kampala Sponsor church has a GETS ID. Type it in, add a prayer note, press Send. No NGO Act filing. No refugee camp bureaucracy. Arrives in 60 seconds.

4



Watch It Work

Your app shows a live trail — like package tracking for a gift. See which program it funded and which community it serves.

🌿 Protection in Uganda's Mission Field

- ✓ Bypasses NGO Act annual registration requirements — GST utility token transfers are not classified as "foreign funding" requiring NGO registration or annual reporting
- ✓ No refugee camp administrative approval — GST reaches camp church educators directly through mobile wallets without settlement authority approval processes
- ✓ Works in Karamoja pastoralist areas with minimal banking infrastructure — only requires a mobile phone and data signal through local Sponsor church leaders
- ✓ 100% delivery — no 20–30% NGO administrative overhead, no bank transfer fees, no duplicate refugee ministry tax requirements reduce the effective amount reaching field workers
- ✓ NFT credentials for LRA survivors — the first verifiable educational records for a generation of northern Ugandans whose schooling was destroyed by 20 years of Joseph Kony's terror

- ★ **Kampala Hub Account:** Your Kampala-based Sponsor church holds the GST treasury and distributes to verified Uganda field missionaries and refugee settlement church workers
- ★ **Refugee Settlement Fund:** Designate GST specifically for Bidi Bidi or Nakivale church-based schools — instantly earmarked, blockchain-verified, transparently traceable
- ★ **LRA Recovery Designation:** Tag gifts "Gulu Post-War School" or "Acholi Trauma Healing Program" — no commingling, full donor accountability
- ★ **Tax Receipts:** US-compatible charitable giving receipts automatically issued by getstoken.org for all donor contributions
- ★ **Survivor Credentialing:** Issue NFT certificates to former child soldiers and LRA survivors completing education programs — permanent records of recovery and achievement

🇺🇬 Uganda — The Pearl of Africa: Why GST Is Strategically Essential Here

- ✦ Uganda's Pentecostal revival has produced **some of the most dynamic church planting and mission-sending movements on the African continent** — with Ugandan missionaries now working in South Sudan, DRC, Rwanda, and beyond. GST gives these indigenous missionaries the same financial tools as Western senders.
- ✦ Uganda hosts the **world's largest refugee settlement at Bidi Bidi** (formerly 280,000+ South Sudanese) and the historic Nakivale settlement (100,000+ from DRC, Burundi, Somalia, and Rwanda). Church workers in these settlements provide the most trusted community education available — but receive almost no accountable external support.
- ✦ Northern Uganda (Gulu, Kitgum, Pader) is still recovering from **20 years of Lord's Resistance Army atrocity under Joseph Kony** — a generation of child soldiers, sex slaves, and displaced families whose educational development was entirely interrupted. Church-based schools are the primary reconstruction vehicle, and they need reliable foreign support.
- ✦ Karamoja region in northeastern Uganda — home to the **Karamojong pastoralist people** — has the lowest school enrollment rate in East Africa (under 20% for girls) and virtually no formal banking infrastructure. GST reaches Karamoja church teachers wherever a mobile signal exists, funding the education that development organizations have failed to deliver for decades.

† Common Questions from Home Church Members †

"Do we need to register our mission under the NGO Act?"

GST utility token transfers are not classified as "foreign organizational funding" requiring NGO Act registration. Resources flow as educational utility tokens, not as NGO grants — bypassing the annual registration and reporting requirements that have administratively crushed many small church-based education programs in Uganda.

"What about Karamoja — how does GST reach nomadic communities?"

GST reaches wherever a mobile data signal exists — which increasingly includes Karamoja thanks to expanding network coverage. Local Karamojong Sponsor church leaders hold GST and distribute to teachers who travel with pastoralist communities, matching the nomadic lifestyle of the people they serve.

"Can we fund a specific refugee settlement school?"

Yes. Your Kampala Sponsor coordinator sets up named programs for Bidi Bidi, Nakivale, and Rwamwanja separately. You tag your gift to the specific settlement, and your dashboard shows real-time progress — which teachers received support and which students are enrolled.

"Can Ugandan churches send missionaries using GST too?"

Absolutely — this is one of GST's most exciting applications. Ugandan Pentecostal churches sending missionaries to South Sudan and DRC can use GST to support their own sent workers with the same accountability and security as any Western sending church.
