## THE PROBLEM WE SOLVE IN VIETNAM

The Communist Party bans unregistered religious groups and monitors all foreign financial transfers to church organizations through the **Ministry of Public Security**. Registered churches wait years for legal status. Any foreign transfer tagged as "Christian ministry" funding triggers immediate government intervention and potential arrest of local leaders.

Hmong, Ede, and other ethnic minority Christians in the Central Highlands and northern mountains face the most severe restrictions — their unregistered house churches can be shut down the moment **foreign religious funding is detected** in banking records. GST's educational utility framing avoids this classification entirely.

## FOLLOW THE MONEY — LIKE A PRAYER CHAIN



### STEP 1 — HOME CHURCH (USA / AUSTRALIA / FRANCE / GERMANY) Donor Opens Free GetSmart Account

Like creating an email account. 5 minutes on your phone. No bank required — or link your existing account. Visit [getstoken.org](https://getstoken.org) to sign up free.



### STEP 2 — INSTANT, LIKE SENDING A TEXT Send GST Tokens to Your Missionary

Type their GETS ID (like an email address). Press send. Arrives in under 60 seconds. **No Ministry of Public Security monitoring. No "religious funding" classification.**



### STEP 3 — MISSION FIELD (CENTRAL HIGHLANDS / NORTHERN MOUNTAINS) Missionary Receives & Distributes

Distributes to Hmong ethnic minority teachers, Ede community literacy programs, and mountain church volunteers — each transaction permanently recorded on blockchain, fully auditable, zero Communist Party visibility.



### STEP 4 — YOU SEE IT HAPPEN Track Your Gift to the Child

Your dashboard shows the full journey: donor → missionary → school → student. Every step timestamped and tamper-proof on blockchain.

## WHY GST IS DIFFERENT IN VIETNAM



### Educational Utility — Not "Religious Funding"

GST is classified as an educational utility token — not a foreign religious donation. The Ministry of Public Security's surveillance flags transfers tagged as "Christian ministry." GST's framing as education funding avoids this classification, letting resources reach Hmong church teachers without triggering government crackdowns.



### Reaches Where No Bank Branch Has Been

Central Highlands and northern mountain communities have zero formal banking infrastructure. But smartphone penetration is growing even in remote areas. GST reaches ethnic minority church leaders via mobile wallet wherever a data signal exists.



### Vietnamese Diaspora Giving Bridge

Vietnamese diaspora Christians in California, Australia, and France are generous givers — but fear that visible financial connections to home churches endanger their families inside Vietnam. GST provides the secure, accountable pipeline they need.



### Built by a 501(c)(3) Nonprofit

GetSmart Token is governed by the Digital Financial Aid Corporation — a US 501(c)(3). Its mission is education. Ours is Vietnam's ethnic minority church. They align perfectly at [getstoken.org](https://getstoken.org).

## Four Steps from Your Pew to a Hmong Mountain Child's Classroom

### Download & Sign Up

Visit [getstoken.org](https://getstoken.org) and sign up with your email. Free, takes 5 minutes. Your church administrator can help. No blockchain knowledge required.

2



### Add Funds

Link your debit card or bank account. Convert dollars to GST tokens — digital offering envelopes that only go where you address them.

3



### Send to Your Missionary

Your ethnic minority church contact or Sponsor hub leader has a GETS ID. Type it in, add a prayer note, press Send. No Communist Party flag. No Ministry of Public Security alert.

### Watch It Work

Your app shows a live trail — like package tracking for a gift. See which program it funded and which community it serves.

### Protection in Vietnam's Mission Field

- ✓ Invisible to Ministry of Public Security monitoring — GST transfers don't appear in Vietnam's foreign religious organization financial surveillance framework
- ✓ Educational utility classification — funding for literacy, vocational training, and community education doesn't trigger the "foreign religious funding" flag that leads to house church shutdowns
- ✓ Reaches remote Central Highlands and northern mountain communities — only requires a smartphone and data signal, no bank branch infrastructure needed
- ✓ Sponsor wallet model — trusted local Hmong and Ede church leaders hold GST and distribute to field workers, keeping all foreign-source visibility outside Vietnam's banking system
- ✓ NFT credentials for ethnic minority teachers — permanent digital certificates outside Vietnam's jurisdiction, impossible to confiscate in a house church raid

- ★ **Consortium Account:** Your missions committee holds a shared GST treasury and routes to verified Vietnamese ethnic minority church leaders — full accountability, zero government visibility for recipients
- ★ **Vocational Program Funding:** Designate GST for coffee processing, embroidery, and motorbike mechanics training tied to Bible literacy — the dual-purpose model that sustains ethnic minority churches economically and spiritually
- ★ **Designated Giving:** Tag gifts "Central Highlands Hmong School" or "Ede Women's Bible Literacy" — earmarked instantly, traceable to you, invisible to Vietnamese authorities
- ★ **Tax Receipts:** US-compatible charitable giving receipts automatically issued by [getstoken.org](https://getstoken.org) for all contributions
- ★ **Teacher Credentialing:** Issue NFT certificates to ethnic minority house church teachers — permanent credentials that exist outside Vietnam's legal jurisdiction

### ★ Vietnam — Land of the Ascending Dragon: Why GST Is Strategically Essential Here

- ♦ Vietnam's Communist Party requires all churches to register with the **Vietnam Committee for Religious Affairs** — a process that takes years and is routinely denied to ethnic minority groups. Unregistered churches that receive detectable foreign funding face immediate police closure and pastor arrest.
- ♦ The Central Highlands ethnic minority church (Ede, Jarai, Bahnar, Mnong peoples) represents **one of Asia's most remarkable church planting movements** — communities with 40%+ illiteracy and zero formal banking access that have embraced the Gospel despite sustained government pressure for decades.
- ♦ Hmong Christians in the northern mountains of **Lai Châu, Điện Biên, and Hà Giang** have faced some of Vietnam's most severe religious persecution — including forced renunciation ceremonies, destruction of homes, and denial of land rights. Foreign funding visibility dramatically increases their targeting risk.
- ♦ Vietnamese diaspora Christians in **California (600,000+), Australia, France, and Germany** desperately want to support their home churches and ethnic minority brothers and sisters — GST gives them an accountable, secure giving pipeline with real-time blockchain verification and zero exposure of in-country recipients.

### † Common Questions from Home Church Members †

#### "Will our giving trigger a government crackdown?"

GST is specifically designed to prevent this. The educational utility classification means funds don't appear as "foreign religious donations" in Vietnam's monitoring framework. The Sponsor wallet model keeps all foreign-source transactions outside Vietnam's visible banking system entirely.

#### "Can we fund a specific ethnic minority village school?"

Yes. Your missionary sets up named programs (e.g., "Điện Biên Hmong Bible Literacy School") and you send directly. Your dashboard shows real-time progress — transparent to you, invisible to Vietnamese authorities.

#### "How do we reach Hmong communities with no banks?"

GST works wherever a smartphone and mobile data signal exist — which is increasingly true even in remote mountain areas. Local Hmong Sponsor church leaders hold GST and distribute to field teachers through trusted community networks, just as they've distributed everything else for decades.

#### "Is this safe for diaspora Vietnamese who still have family inside Vietnam?"

Yes. The pseudonymous wallet structure means no financial record links a diaspora donor's name to a specific in-country recipient. Vietnamese diaspora givers in California can support home churches without creating any visible connection that could endanger their families still inside Vietnam.
